MEDICAL DISCLOSURE FOR ENTROPION

This pet was diagnosed with Entropion, which is a rolling in of the eyelid(s) causing fur to rub on the surface of the eye. Entropion can be very irritating to the cornea and even cause ulcers of the cornea. Surgery was performed in order to correct this issue. He/she will need to wear an e-collar for two weeks after the surgery to ensure that they do not rub at the eye and cause failure of the surgery. Although surgery is usually successful, there is a chance that one of the eyelids may roll in towards the eye in the future, and that the pet may require additional surgery. All follow-up care will need to be done at the owner's veterinarian and at the owner's expense.
