



HEALED JAW FRACTURE

MEDICAL DISCLOSURE FOR HEALED JAW FRACTURE

This pet had a fractured jaw that was treated while in our care. Treatment can consist of external and/or internal stabilization. Despite the fracture being well-healed on palpation and x-rays, the jaw may not be as strong as normal bone, so the pet should not have hard toys or bones for the next several months. Although the pet is doing well now, the pet may develop dental issues that will need to be addressed in the future. Routine check-ups with your regular veterinarian are recommended. All follow-up care will need to be done with the owner's veterinarian and at the owner's expense.
